Principal Update Mr. Hewitt	 Mr. Hewitt commented that fall teacher clubs have been running smoothly. The kids have been engaged and appear to enjoy clubs very much. Dismissal to these clubs has been going well too. Most of the clubs will be ending this week; Art Club and Bollywood Club will continue until the end of the month. The Veterans Day assembly took place Mon., Nov. 13. All students from Pre-K to 3rd 						
	 grade were in attendance. The students presented poems and songs and gave certificates to loved ones. The Streamkeepers program has begun. Mr. Hewitt was able to take a trip to the stream twice with two different groups. This year permission slips have been implemented; students will need to submit these in order to visit the stream as it is off school property. Mr. Hewitt is excited to see more from this program. Mr. Hewitt noted that the concern pertaining to the divider in the gymnasium has now been resolved.

	- The Scholastic Book Fair will take place from Thurs., Nov. 16 to Tues., Nov. 21. Students will have an opportunity to browse the fair on preview day (Nov. 15) before they can officially shop.						
	- The theme of this book fair is "Fall into Reading." Set up is happening Tues., Nov. 14. - Presently, there is a need for more volunteers for Mon., Nov. 20 and Tues., Nov. 21 in the afternoons.						
	- We are taking part in All for Books again this year. For this program, families round up or make donations at the fair. The money collected is used to buy books at the fair for BF families.						
	<u>Double Event (Mini Turkey Trot & Book Fair Special Event)</u> - Rachelle Picarello spoke.						
	- This Sat., Nov. 18 (10am to 1pm) there will be a double event with the Mini Turkey Trot Fun Run and the Book Fair special event happening on the same day.						
	- During this event, Teacher Experience Raffles will be offered between 10am and 1pm. It will be the only time this school year for students to enter and win. Winners will be drawn at 1pm. Families do not have to be present for the drawing.						
	<u>Mini Turkey Trot Fun Run (10am to 11am)</u> - Rachelle Picarello spoke.						
	- The Mini Turkey Trot Fun Run will take place from 10am to 11am at the BF parking lot. The race will begin promptly at 10:30am with students						
	 running in groups from oldest to youngest. This is a rain or shine event. It may be cold; please wear layers. Fee: \$15 to participate in the race; register runners get a turkey medal 						

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	 The first 35 registered runners will get a BF stress ball; thus far, 50 kids have signed up. This will be a 10 lap run (approx. one mile) around the BF parking lot. Details of how to track laps will be given at the event. As the race is taking place in the parking lot, no parking will be allowed in the lot during the time of the race. Families are advised to park on the street. The lot will be cleared for the event that follows.
	 <u>Book Fair Special Event (11am to 1pm)</u> Kristen Paladino spoke. This event will take place in the gym. This is a free event to attend. There will be free drinks and food provided including Starbucks coffee and bagels. Books will be for sale.
	 <u>Parents Night Out</u> Petra Crevier spoke. Parents Night out will take place on Sat., Dec. 2 from 5:30pm to 8:15pm at AmeriKick. Ages: 4 years and up; siblings are welcome. Must be fully potty trained. Cost: \$20 for 1 child; \$18 per child for two or more children. 100% of the proceeds will be given to the BF PTO Children will take part in karate class, go through different obstacle courses and play games.
