Introductions Megan Coopersmith	- Board introduced themselves: Megan Coopersmith - PTO President, Petra Crevier - 1st VP, Rachelle Picarello - 2nd VP, Nicole Bottrel - Corresponding Secretary, Ilana Hernandez - Recording Secretary, Kristen Paladino - Treasurer
Principal Update Mr. Hewitt	- Mr. Hewitt spoke about the Lost and Found that is located at the entrance of the school. Families are encouraged to pick up any of their items that may be in the Lost and Found. Unclaimed items will be donated after winter break to the PTO clothing drive. Before donating, the items will be reviewed for any labels and returned accordingly. Reminder: Label all of your student's belongings moving forward. - The first trimester has ended. Grades will be posted to Genesis on Friday, Dec. 12 by the
	end of the day. - On Dec. 11, Ms. Riley, a Junior at LHS, came in and taught third graders ballet moves from the Nutcracker in the BF gymnasium. The kids really loved it. Big thanks to Ms. Skorupa, Mrs. Cimorelli, Ms. LaFlamme and Ms. Offery for organizing this experience for the students!
	- There have been mix-ups with the cafeteria menu since Thanksgiving break. Families are encouraged to use the <u>link</u> in Mr. Hewitt's newsletter to stay updated on the menu. Online menus are kept up to date; therefore, the plan is to stop handing out menus in paper form. Families can also use the <u>Nutrislice app</u> on their Apple devices as well. There is an option to print menus for families who prefer to have a printed copy. Here is the <u>printable menu</u> for the month of December.
	- BF staff have been working to help out the socioeconomically disadvantaged families at the school to get kids gifts for the holidays and provide them with support during the holiday season.

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	- The walls in the school are bare right now in preparation for the hallways and main office to be repainted. This will brighten up the halls and be completed before winter break. Student work will be posted in the halls once they return from break.
PTO President Update Megan Coopersmith	 Megan Coopersmith spoke and provided an update on school assemblies. Two school assemblies sponsored by the PTO have been booked: Eyes of the Wild will take place on Fri., Dec. 15. It cost the PTO \$615 Planetarium will take place on Tues., Feb. 20 costing \$600. The remaining assembly budget is \$785 for the rest of the year.
Recaps Respective Chairs	Dine to Donate Petra Crevier spoke. The Dine to Donate for the month of November took place at Shake Shack on Nov. 14. The check is still pending as a form had to be filled out and submitted. Presently, the check is being processed, which should take 4-6 weeks. Shake Shack will be donating 25% of the proceeds to the PTO. Teacher Appreciation Meal Sponsored by Pre-K/K Ilana Hernandez spoke. The first Teacher and Staff Appreciation Luncheon took place on Thurs., Nov. 16. It was the first day of conferences. The luncheon was Fall Feast themed with lots of food for the teachers and staff to enjoy. Some food served include tomato soup, roasted chicken, mashed potatoes, stuffing, roasted vegetables, pie, etc. This meal was sponsored exclusively by Pre-K and Kindergarten families. A number of families donated food and drinks. There was a total of \$435 in monetary donations that was used to purchase hot food items and desserts. The teachers and staff were very appreciative of the meal. A big thanks to the Pre-K and Kindergarten families who made this possible! Fall Book Fair Kristen Paladino spoke. The Fall Scholastic Book fair took place from Nov. 15 to Nov. 21. Total sales was \$8958, which doesn't include Scholastic Dollars and All for Books contributions. This total was a little below last year's totals. Scholastic has been paid. An email confirmation has been received and there are 4400 Scholastic Dollars in our account presently. The PTO overspent when it came to the All for Books program, which provides underprivileged students with vouchers to buy books during the fair. The voucher was for the amount of \$8 this year. The PTO board will discuss possibly reducing it to \$5 for the next fair.

Mini Turkey Trot Fun Run w/ Teacher Experience Raffles

- The first Mini Turkey Trot Fun Run took place on Sat., Nov. 18.
- Approximately 70-80 kids registered and ran.
- There was great weather for running and lots of smiles. The kids loved the turkey medals. There are some left over and can be used at a future event.
- The Teacher Experience Raffles also took place during this event. All of the winners were notified and the teachers providing the experiences have been made aware of the winners. Teachers should be reaching out soon to schedule these experiences. It is a busy time right now so families are asked to be patient with teachers in scheduling these experiences.

Parents Night Out

- The event took place at Amerikick on Sat., Dec. 2 from 5:30pm to 8:15pm.
- Kids had fun. Pizza, cookies and water were purchased by the PTO for the kids to enjoy.
- A parent helper to stay the entire event is needed next time around. There were some complaints about some children; families were contacted about this.
- Overall, it was a great fundraising event. 100% of the proceeds goes to our school. Sensei Vince expressed that they enjoyed having us and would want to have another event in the future.

Holiday Shop

- The BF Holiday Shop was open in the evening to families on Thurs., Dec. 7 and during the day to students on Fri., Dec. 8.
- Originally, the budget was set to \$350; however, as the event was happening, the Holiday Shop was selling out quickly and additional purchases for merchandise were made. In total, \$1200 was spent.
- Approx. 30 students were given golden tickets; 28 kids turned theirs in.
- It was a fun experience. The kids were so excited and had a great time buying stuff for their families and friends.
- This was the first time that the Holiday Shop was open during the school day. Teachers were fine working out the time to send students to the shop.
- Next year we anticipate increasing the budget and possibly hosting the Holiday Shop in a space other than the gym to avoid conflicting with the plans of the PE teachers.
- This was not a fundraiser. The Holiday Shop is intended to provide an opportunity for students to buy inexpensive gifts for their families and friends for the holidays. All items were \$1 to \$2. The PTO does not expect to raise money from this event.
