Introductions Megan Coopersmith	- Board introduced themselves: Megan Coopersmith - PTO President, Petra Crevier - 1st VP, Rachelle Picarello - 2nd VP, Nicole Bottrel - Corresponding Secretary, Ilana Hernandez - Recording Secretary, Kristen Paladino - Treasurer
Principal Update Mr. Hewitt	- Mr. Hewitt provided an update on the Multicultural Night student raffle winners. All of the students who won the raffle had lunch with Mr. Hewitt. They were able to bring friends with them and had fun. - In Mr. Hewitt's newsletter, information was provided about the Preschool Expansion program happening in our district. Mr. Hewitt explained that the district has five years to utilize preschool expansion funding to complete its universe (approx. 500 preschoolers). Currently there are Pre-K classrooms at BF and LES. BF Teacher Danae Pesce is leaving to lead the new full day Pre-K program "Cardinal Kids" at LHS. Another Pre-K classroom is expected to open at Eldridge Park later this year. The goal is for all LTPS elementary schools to provide Pre-K so students can go to their zoned school. Mrs. Loren Sansone will be the new teacher replacing Mrs. Pesce at BF. - It was also noted that there have been conversations about other changes coming to the district in the future. Mr. Hewitt noted that two full grade levels (3K and 4K) will be added to each elementary school as part of the Preschool Expansion initiative. To make room, the hope moving forward is that elementary schools will have Pre-K to 2nd grade; LIS will have 3rd to 5th grade; LMS will have 6th to 8th grade; and LHS with 9th to 12th grade. These changes may begin in 2026/2027; still tentative. - Field trips for K to 2nd grade have been planned. Mr. Hewitt thanked the PTO for

- Moving forward, whenever there are outbreaks of contagious infections in the classroom, letters will go home notifying others in the class. These letters will be from the school nurse; this wasn't happening earlier in the year.
 - This month is busy. Valentine's Day and 100th Day of School are this week and classes will be celebrating. The 2nd grade concert is tomorrow, Feb. 13th. We are expecting inclement weather. If there's a delayed opening, the concert is planned to continue as usual. If there is a cancellation, the concert will be moved to Thursday, Feb. 15th.
- St. Baldrick's is happening again this year. This will be Team Ben Franklin's 14th year participating in the event. Some team members will be shaving their heads in solidarity with children with cancer. Families are welcome to participate by having their heads shaved or donating. The shave event will be taking place on Friday, Mar. 8th in the All Purpose Room. Families are also welcome to attend the event at Amalfi's on Saturday, Mar. 9th at 11am.

PTO President Update

- Planetarium Assembly is happening on Tuesday, Feb. 20th. For this assembly, a dome is set up in half of the gym. Throughout the day, presentations will take place inside the dome. Students will go inside the dome when scheduled. The presentations are grade specific so students will be attending by grade. The PTO is funding this assembly.
- LTPS Community Conversation meeting is taking place on Wednesday, Mar. 6th from 7 to 8pm in the BF library. This is a district event where the superintendent and a few BOE members visit each school and have a meeting with families to get feedback.
