Introductions  Megan Coopersmith	- Board introduced themselves: Megan Coopersmith - PTO President, Petra Crevier - 1st VP, Rachelle Picarello - 2nd VP, Nicole Bottrel - Corresponding Secretary, Ilana Hernandez - Recording Secretary, Kristen Paladino - Treasurer
Principal Update  Mr. Hewitt	- St. Baldrick's took place this month. This was Team Ben Franklin's 14th year participating in this fundraising event for childhood cancer research. A number of students, teachers and staff raised money and went bald to raise awareness. The fundraising continued with the Color Run that took place on Mar. 9th and Pie in the Face event on Mar. 14th. As a school, approx. \$12643 was raised and donated to the St. Baldrick's organization. Mr. Hewitt expressed being super proud of this achievement.  - LTEF is hosting the first Lawrence Has Talent event. It will take place on Thursday, Apr. 11th. Two BF students, Bianca Agosto and Kyleigh Brennan, are finalists. Tickets are presently on sale.  - Summer programs will be taking place at BF this year. ESY (a program for special education students) and FLIGHT (formerly Destinations, a program for general education students who need Math and ELA support) will take place from Jul. 8th to Aug. 1st. Jumpstart for incoming kindergartners will be taking place in August; this is a half day program. 3rd grade students moving up to LIS will also be offered a Jumpstart program at LIS in the month of August. All summer programs run on a Monday to Thursday schedule.  - A math webinar organized by Kristin Burke and Sarah Foster took place on Mar. 20th from 6 to 7pm. The webinar focused on how families can support their child's math skills and integrate math into daily life. It was presented by Liesl McChonchie. The recording of this webinar will be available on the LTPS website for the next month, if families are interested in viewing it.

- Kindergarten registration for the 2024-2025 school year is now open. Registration is online and closes on Aug. 2, 2024. - Mr. Hewitt thanked the PTO for organizing the teacher appreciation luncheons sponsored by 1st and 2nd grade families. There was tons of good food and the teachers and staff appreciated these lunches. Report cards are to be posted on Genesis after Spring Break. - On Apr. 23rd, all 3rd graders will be going on their field trip. While on this trip, students will be able to release the trout. More clarity is needed on how these students will be selected; caring for trout is primarily the responsibility of Mr. Wilson and Mrs. Basmagy's - Approx. a week after the trout are released, the chicks are expected to arrive. This is a learning opportunity particularly for kindergarteners. - Mr. Hewitt noted that during the BF's Community Conversation with the district administration, that took place on Mar. 6th, he received feedback that newsletters were sent out too early on Saturday mornings. To address this concern, Mr. Hewitt will now be sending out newsletters at a later time on Saturdays. He will also be using Blackboard only, as the program has language translation, to send out these newsletters. He won't be using Talking Points for this to avoid annoying parents with text message alerts. **PTO President** - Planetarium Assembly took place on Tuesday, Feb. 20th. A dome was put up in the gymnasium for students to enter. Students were able to view different constellations and Update planets while inside. Megan Coopersmith - A teacher request was granted for an Earth Day themed assembly. It will take place on, Wed., Apr. 24th. Similar to the concert assembly that happened two years ago, students will be able to view a concert that will have Earth Day centered music. Questions or Comments All	Q: When will more information be released about the FLIGHT summer program? Will students be invited or have to sign up?  A: A flyer with more information will be available soon. Students who are enrolled in ASI programs will be invited initially to take part in the summer program. There may possibly be room for other students who need the support to sign up after. The program will take place at Ben Franklin from Jul. 8 to Aug. 1st. It is a half day program that runs from Monday to Thursday (answered by Mr. Hewitt).

Q: The 3rd grade and Kindergarten field trips were scheduled for the same day this year. As a parent who would like to chaperone for both trips, is it possible to reschedule one of them? **A:** Typically, multiple grade wide field trips aren't scheduled for the same day. The Kindergarten field trip was scheduled way in advance. The 3rd grade trip was scheduled more recently and was based on limited dates available for the trout to be released. At this point, it is too late to reschedule these trips. Also, when it comes to choosing parent chaperones for events, typically, there are lotteries to choose who can chaperone to give all parents a chance to attend the trip (answered by Mr. Hewitt). Q: What happens if you're a parent helper for a teacher club and cannot help on a specific day due to an emergency? Who should be contacted if this happens? **A:** If a parent helper cannot make it, they can reach out to Megan Coopersmith directly (via email or phone) or call the BF main office and the message will get to Megan Coopersmith. **Q:** For the yearbook, when will the committee be collecting pictures? **A:** An email will be sent out to 3rd grade families in the next couple of weeks requesting photos. The yearbook is currently being formatted. **Q:** Will the next PTO meeting be on Zoom or in person? A: At this point, we are unsure. We will provide an update on social media and in our newsletter as we get closer to the date. **Q:** When is the sign-up for Kindergarten Jumpstart? **A:** Sign-up will possibly be available mid-April. **Comment:** The BF school student directory is being updated.
