Principal Update  Mr. Hewitt	<ul> <li>- Mr. Hewitt was impressed with the PTO sponsored Multicultural Night event. It was an awesome experience for students, families and staff alike.</li> <li>- St. Baldrick's fundraising events at BF have come to an end. On March 14, shavees went bald and raised funds to bring awareness to childhood cancer. Students also had an opportunity to help raise money by taking part in Pie Day, where students were able to pie teachers and staff in the face. The Color Run organized by Mrs. Cimorelli accompanied by face painting with Ms. Skorupa took place on March 15. As a school, a total of \$3313 was raised.</li> <li>- Students were also able to partake in the Kids Heart Challenge in an effort to raise money for the American Heart Association. This fundraising event is spearheaded by the PE teachers and over \$1k was raised by BF students.</li> <li>- The month of March started off with Read Across America. To celebrate the love for reading, a chain link was created with books read by BF students and adults. It is hanging throughout the school and will continue through the end of the month.</li> <li>- Ms. Offery will be retiring this school year. Mr. Hewitt is in the process of hiring her replacement and hopes to have a person before the school year is up.</li> </ul>

	- There will be three early dismissal days in April. Parent/teacher conferences are taking place from April 9 to 11. Please start putting together plans for early dismissal.  Conferences in the spring are scheduled on an as needed basis and not mandatory.  - Reminder: Attendance is marked as excused or unexcused based on NJ state guidelines. The state categorizes most absences as unexcused even with a medical note. The only exceptions are religious holidays and Take Your Child to Work day. This is because the state is tracking instruction time. Tardiness has also become more frequent as of late. Please try to be on time when possible.

Recaps Respective Chairs	Book Exchange  - Petra Crevier.  - Book Exchange took place on Fri., March 7. There were sections this year: informational books, chapter books and multilingual books.  - Each student was able to take up to 6 "new to them" books home.  - The PTO collects gently used books all year long. Please consider donating any books to the PTO by dropping them off in the BF front entrance vestibule. If the books are too heavy to transport, reach out to the PTO and a pick up arrangement can be made.  - Thank you to Ms. Skorupa and her students, who made bookmarks that were given to each student this year!  Multicultural Night  - Ilana Hernandez and Petra Crevier spoke.  - The PTO's 2nd annual Multicultural Night took place on Wed., March 12. There was lots of participation from families and staff this year.  - There were 16 activity tables hosted by families in the BF airport (gymnasium); over 21 countries were represented in the dishes that were brought in by families in the Global Marketplace (all purpose room).  - New this year was cultural performance showcases. 4 BF students performed on stage in the Global Marketplace. BF parent, Susan Iglesias, also volunteered to be the event's DJ playing international music in the Global Marketplace and airport background music in the BF airport.
